**Subject Area: World Languages**  
**Course Name: Latin IV Poetry**

**Summary:** Latin IV students in this course receive Honors credit with a weighted grade. They are expected to perform at a higher level than the Latin III students. Latin poetry students will read and discuss Vergil's masterpiece, the Aeneid, in both Latin and in English. They analyze the Augustan context of the poem, the poetic meter of the verse, and its mythological and archaeological roots. As time permits, they may also read selections from Catullus, Horace and Ovid. Students who choose may enroll in the High School Plus Program with Camden County College. These students will receive three college credits for a final grade of "B" or better.
